### **On-Time is Essential to Success** Lunch Detention & Saturday School

BEING ON TIME IS VITAL TO STUDENT SUCCESS! In order for students to earn credit for their classes, the state mandates that they must be in class for a specific amount of time. Being late to school or class decreases a student's time in class. After 6 unexcused tardies, a 90-minute weekday after-school detention will be assigned (3:30-5:00). Any subsequent tardy detention(s) will be served on an assigned Saturday from 7:00-10:00 a.m. (180 minutes).

Skipping any weekday detention will result in Saturday School. Skipping Saturday School will result in 2 ISS days, and the student will be rescheduled for the original detention.

Additionally, students who do not serve their assigned detention will not be allowed to participate or spectate in after-school activities until the detention is served.

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# **Tutoring**

Tutoring is FREE for all students. Students who are required to attend must be present on assigned day(s). All other students may attend tutoring in all content areas as needed for support.
